# PPB Honoree REGIS PHILBIN **Still Going Strong**

The combination of **REGIS PHILBIN** being an entertaining storyteller and a TV icon made the last luncheon for the Pacific Pioneer Broadcasters a great way to wrap up 2016. Philbin was honored with the **ART GILMORE** Career Achievement Award in November thanks to his celebrated status among the broadcasters. His career spans over half a century, and the lovable host of talk shows and game shows has earned a Guinness World Record for the most hours on U.S. television. To date, at 85, he's had close to 17,000 hours in front of the camera. And, oh the stories he can tell.


The PPB crowd heard some anecdotes from Philbin, and some tales from his colleagues and friends. The dais had top producers and industry executives such as JOHN SEVE-RINO, the former president of ABC-TV, who revealed he originally hired Regis to do movie reviews on the news, but then got him hosting A.M. Los Angeles. STEVE OBER who produced Live! with Regis and Kathie Lee expressed his affection for Regis and all the fun times they had together.

That was echoed by producer RICK ROSNER, best known for creating the cop show CHiPs. Producer/director LARRY EINHORN noted that the Guinness Record means Regis has been in front of the camera an average of one hour a day throughout his career. **TOM BATTISTA** said he flew in just to attend the luncheon. "I was Regis' best man when he married Joy in 1970, so I didn't want to miss this," he told everyone at Sportsmen's Lodge.

**SARAH PURCELL**, who co-hosted A.M. Los Angeles, said, "Good Lord, it was in 1974 when I had the great good fortune to work with Regis. There were also clips from Philbin's career, and seeing Regis as the announcer and sidekick on The Joey Bishop Show filled the room with nostalgia.

There was an ovation when PPB President ALAN PERRIS presented the honor to Regis. Then Philbin gave thanks and said, "It's great to see so many people I've known throughout my career. It all began for me when I went to Notre Dame. I was told to join the Navy outfit there, and at the end of my second year in school, war broke out in Korea and so I went in the Navy for two years. My ship came back to San Diego in 1955, and on my last day in service I was packing my bags and an old Marine Major asked me, 'What are you going to do with the rest of your life?' I thought I could do TV, but I wasn't sure. And this guy looked at me and said, 'Don't you know you can do anything you want in this life. You've only got to want it bad enough. Now, do you want it?' I stepped back, clicked my heels, gave him a salute, and said, 'Yes, sir, I want it.'


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A huge crowd attended the November PPB luncheon honoring television icon **REGIS PHILBIN**.

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So, he ordered me to 'get in the car, go up to Hollywood, and make it happen.' And I did. I drove up and saw a guy at channel 13 and he asked me if I really wanted a job. I said 'yes,' and he handed me a broom. That's true."

Also a highlight of the PPB gathering, past President CHUCK STREET presented the organization's Diamond Circle Award to STU BILLETT, who he called "a regular guy who has accomplished extraordinary things."

After serving in the U.S. Marine Corps, Billett went to NYU (on the G.I. Bill) and developed an interest in writing for television. His big break was getting an internship on The \$64,000 Question, which lead to a career developing and producing innovative top game shows, including ABC's *Split Second* from Hatos-Hall Productions.

Between 1970 and 2014, **MIKE CALLAGHAN** served as chief engineer at KPPC, KWST, and KIIS-FM. He taught electronics and broadcasting at Pasadena City College.



SAM LOVULLO was PPB's president for three years, 2009 to 2011. He served in the U.S. Army during the Korean War and graduated from UCLA with a degree in accounting and finance. His first industry job was at CBS-TV as an accountant

and he went on to become manager of business affairs for CBS-TV, West Coast. In 1969, after a short stint as associate producer of the Jonathan Winters Show, Sam and associates FRANK PEPPIATT and JOHN AYLESWORTH brought Hee Haw to the CBS network. The variety show, hosted by **BUCK OWENS** and ROY CLARK, featured country music and corn pone humor and became known for its scantily clad "Hee Haw Honeys." The series eventually went into syndication and became the number one syndicated TV show in the nation. Sam produced all 25 first-run seasons, which has aired continuously for the last 47 years. He also produced specials for JOHN WAYNE, HERB ALPERT, and The Harlem Globetrotters, among others. Sam has received dozens of awards and was active in many charitable organizations. He authored a book entitled My Life in the Kornfield: My 25 Years at Hee Haw.

**ELWIN REEDER** began his career at 16 by managing theaters. Later, he worked for CBS radio and TV on popular programs including those starring **JACK BENNY**, **RED SKELTON** and **BOB CROSBY**, and live television dramas *Climax* and *Playhouse* 90.

FRED WESTBROOK (or WOSTBROCK) was a talent agent who represented classic game show hosts including GENE RAYBURN, TOM KENNEDY and WINK MARTINDALE. Known often as "Mr. Game Show," Fred was an author, working with DAVID SCHWARTZ and STEVE RYAN in compiling *The Encyclopedia of TV Game Shows* and *The Ultimate TV Game Show Book*. In addition to his passion for game shows, Fred was an agent for stars like PHYLLIS DILLER and ADAM WEST.
