P.J. OCHLAN has been an actor since 1986, and has enjoyed a diverse career from critically acclaimed feature films and TV series regular roles to new media projects; from his own long-running radio shows to countless voice-overs and audio books; and, from Broadway and the New York Shakespeare Festival to stand-up comedy. He's been recognized with numerous awards, and has worked with some of the most iconic directors, producers, and actors including JODIE FOSTER, CLINT EASTWOOD, ROBIN WILLIAMS, SCOTT RUDIN, GARRY MARSHALL and JOSEPH PAPP. P.J. was the 2017 Audie Award winner and has earned multiple Earphone Awards. He is sponsored by Board Member DON WHITTEMORE.

FRANK PESCE is an actor who appeared in several TV series including: Baretta, Kojak, Night Rider, Miami Vice, and Matlock, just to name a few. He also appeared over 70 films like: Beverly Hills Cop, Top Gun, Midnight Run, Donnie Brasco and acted with his good friend of over 40 years, Sylvester Stallone, in the movie Creed. In 1991, he wrote and appeared the movie, 29th Street, the story of Frank's young life and his experience with the N.Y. State Lottery. Board Member CARSON SCHREIBER is sponsoring Frank.

JOEY REYNOLDS rose to fame as a Top 40 radio personality during the 1960s and 1970s, amassing huge audiences in the northeast and was named Billboard Magazine's DJ of the Year three times. He is often regarded as the originator of "shock-jock radio" — garnering widespread publicity for some outlandish on and off-air stunts; including playing Sherry by the Four Seasons for hours on end. As a thank you, the Four Seasons produced a special radio jingle for the introduction of Joey's daily radio show. Reynolds was the focus of a two-part series on The Oprah Winfrey Show concerning talk radio personalities, on which more than a dozen of his media peers paid tribute to him. In 1988, he was inducted into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame. Joey and a partner came up with the idea of placing TV monitors inside taxi cabs in N.Y. with a slide show of ads. "SHOTGUN TOM" **KELLY** was the announcer and sponsored Joey.

RUS SARNOFF has 30 years in TV as a producer, line producer, associate producer and executive in charge of production. His varied career includes *The Montel Williams Show* and *The Willard Scott Show, Hometown Hero* and *Rescue 911*. He was involved in sitcoms, news programs, variety, game shows and worked on the special, *JOHN DENVER and Friend* - that "friend" was FRANK SINATRA. Today, Rus runs a marketing agency. Board Member JOHN GOLDHAMMER is sponsoring Rus.

DIANE SCHUUR is widely regarded as a leading vocalist and pianist in contemporary jazz. Blind from birth, she is gifted with perfect pitch and initially taught herself to play the piano by ear. With a recording career that spans three decades, including two Grammys as well as numerous TV and radio appearances, Diane has performed at Carnegie Hall, the Kennedy Center, Lincoln Center, the White House, and at countless festivals and theaters around the world. Her musical collaborations include work with the COUNT BASIE Orchestra, B.B. KING, DAVE GRUSIN, RAY CHARLES, STEVIE WONDER, BARRY MANILOW and JOSE FELICIANO, among others. Most recently, she recorded an homage to two of her mentors, FRANK SINATRA and STAN **GETZ**. The CD, entitled I Remember You (With Love To Stan and Frank) also commemorates her "official" discovery 35 years ago by Getz at the 1979 Monterey Jazz Festival. Vice President "SHOTGUN TOM KELLY" is her sponsor.

MANNY SOLANA began acting in 1955 modeling in New York City and appeared live on Westinghouse Studio One in 1956. He continued his career through 1965 and did modeling, commercials, television and Broadway acting and appeared in the movie *Parole Violators* in 1992. PPB Assistant Treasurer MICHAEL BROCKMAN is Manny's sponsor.

KRIS ERIK STEVENS is a multi-talented radio and voice over-artist. Early in his career, he was inducted into the Nebraska Radio Hall of Fame for his exemplary appearance in the Omaha market. Soon after, he became a success as radio's youngest air personality in Chicago and was presented with the Billboard Magazine Radio Entertainment Award for Broadcast Excellence at WLS in Chicago. Kris maintained #1 ratings in Detroit, Pittsburgh, Miami, Atlanta, and at KKDJ and KIIS-FM in Los Angeles. In L.A. he opened Kris Stevens Enterprises and began winning awards for his work in advertising and production. Kris is the highly recognizable voice and host of *Movie Tunes* and is heard internationally on the *Voice of America*. BRUCE CHANDLER is sponsoring Kris.

MARBRY STEWARD (a.k.a.: MAUREEN O'CONNELL) spent over 50 years in radio, television, and the theatre as an actor, producer, director, writer, singer, and voice-over actor. She has 250 voice credits in England, Spain, and the U.S., has appeared several films and on TV including Days of Our Lives, General Hospital, and The Story of David. Marbry's theatre credits include The Miracle Worker, Wait Until Dark, and The Crucible. Her sponsor is ED STAUSS.

BARBARA TUURI has had a 40 career in television administration, starting as an account assistant at KPTV in Portland then assistant to the VP of publicity at WBTV in Charlotte. She joined Warner Bros. in 1982 as assistant to the vice president of publicity and subsequently was assistant to executive vice president of business affairs and assistant to the president of Warner Bros. Domestic Distribution. Since 2011, Barbara has been the assistant to the president of Warner Bros. Consumer Products and DC Entertainment. BARBARA WILLIAMS is sponsoring Barbara Tuuri.

DARRELL WAYNE has been in radio for 45 years and began in Orange County at station KEZY as an engineer then worked in Inglewood and Riverside in production and as an announcer. In 1976, he worked for the famous radio team of Drake/ Chenault and joined KROQ in the 80's where he was known as "The Insane Darrell Wayne." Since 2010, he's owned KTHO in Lake Tahoe and is currently working there and at KABC, KDSK, and Boss Boss Radio. Darrell is sponsored by board member DON WHITTEMORE.

NANCY BRADLEY WIARD began as an administrative assistant in human resources and in programming. During the late 60's and 70's she was at CBS Television working in the programming department and became the associate producer on *The Young and the Restless*. She moved up to producer in 1986 where she remained for the next 14 years. In 2010, she became consultant on *Days of Our Lives*. She is currently at Warner Marketing and was sponsored by PPB President ALAN PERRIS.

BARBARA WILLIAMS retired after having spent 32 years in the TV/motion picture industry starting as assistant to the producer on two TV pilots: *V* and *Scarecrow and Mrs. King.* She then went on to work as an assistant on various TV pilots as well as assistant production office coordinator on the motion picture *Dangerous Minds.* Her sponsor is Board Member and Membership Chair, **MARCIA MINOR.**
