Dodger Hall of Fame Broadcaster Jaime Jarrín Honored at Luncheon

PB's January luncheon was a celebration of two families – the Los Angeles Dodger's family and that of our honoree, Spanish language broadcaster, JAIME JARRÍN.

To start the afternoon's celebration of a deserving honoree, PPB President CHUCK STREET introduced several baseball celebrities seated in the audience: TOREY LOVULLO, the Bench Coach for World Series Champion Boston Red Sox and son of past President SAM LOVULLO; former Dodger pitcher FERNANDO VALENZUELA and broadcaster PEPE YNIGUEZ, both of whom work in the booth with Jaime. Board Chair JEANNE DeVIVIER BROWN read letters of congratulations from PETER O'MALLEY, former owner of the Dodgers, and sportscaster ROSS PORTER.

Jaime's son, **JORGE JARRÍN** began the tributes by telling the story of how his father came to Los Angeles from Ecuador where he got his first radio job at age 16. In 1955, Jaime watched the

Brooklyn Dodgers win their first World Series and fell in love with baseball. He was working at KWKW in 1958 when the team moved to L.A. and has been a part of the Dodgers ever since.

Jorge is frequently asked, "What's it like to be the son of a Hall of Fame broadcaster." He usually replies that his father has been "a huge influence, both personally and professionally." He

described how personally, Jaime showed his son how to be a loving and supportive father and professionally how to be a good broadcaster.

MICHAEL YOUNG, vice president of sales for the Dodgers talked about what Jaime has done for the team by saying, "the O'Malleys built the stadium, but it is Jaime and Fernando who have kept the doors open. Jaime is the one who drove the Latino community to the Dodgers.

Past **ART GILMORE** Career Achievement Award recipient and huge Dodger supporter **LARRY KING** said, "I don't understand a word of Spanish but I've listened to him and Jaime makes the game come alive. I'm in the presence of greatness and I'm honored to be here."

Newscaster **LAURA DIAZ** talked about Jaime's "beautiful baritone voice. He could read the El Monte phone book and make you cry. Latinos go running to hear Jaime call a game. He's a true rock star." Laura called him "a gentleman who is generous with giving his time to up and coming broadcasters."

Fellow Dodger broadcaster **VIN SCULLY** began his remarks by saying, "Hi, everybody and a very pleasant good afternoon to you," a familiar greeting to anyone who has ever listened to a Dodgers' broadcast.

The veteran of 65 seasons with the team doesn't travel much anymore and said that what he misses are "those wonderful nights on the road. I loved the hours I spent with Jaime

and our long dinners together. We have a great relationship and now, I'm having lunch with Jamie and still having a good time." The Dodgers are the only major league club to feature two Hall of Fame announcers. It was a memorable moment when Scully presented the Art Gilmore Career Achievement Award to a deserving and grateful Jaime Jarrín.

In his acceptance speech, Jaime said, "Vin, you've been everything to me. You've always been in my corner. WALTER O'MALLEY understood the value of the Spanish language market when he moved the team to L.A. and made a broadcast deal with KWKW, the station where I was working at the time." In a moving tribute, Jaime said in closing, "I owe my success to my wife **Blanca** and the support of my sons and their families."

Kay's big break in broadcasting came when, as a contestant on the game show Beat the Odds, she beat the odds; here's how: during a break on the set, a man asked for people to raise their hands if they would be interested in auditioning as contestants for You Don't Say, an Andrews-Yagemann production hosted by TOM KENNEDY. Kay raised her

a real winner when he saw one, the show's producer hired her as his secretary and program talent coordinator.

Kay went on to build a great career as talent coordinator for such hit game shows as *It Takes Two*, with **VIN SCULLY**, *I'll Bet* with **JACK NARZ** and Liar's Club, with ROD SERLING. When Goodson-Todman brought Password to Los Angeles, Kay let it be known that she was available. She


CHUCK SOUTHCOTT


creaky old actors, now in our 80s, will finally get to meet", says John. He's still busy acting, and writing his memoirs - not as a book, but as a play.
