Chuck asked Dennis Prager about the three most extraordinary people he's interviewed. Dennis talked about how the listeners have been the ones who have touched his life and told the story of a mother who said, "how can you be happier than your most miserable child?"

Doug McIntyre was asked about the difference between being on the air in the mornings (as he is now) and doing an overnight show. He said, "morning shows pay about triple." Asked how he got in the business, Doug said he used to listen to **RAY BRIEM** who was a pilot. At the time, Doug was writing an article on the Wright Brothers and he and Ray became friends. Doug ended up taking over for Ray when he retired. The best piece of advice Doug ever received was "never lie to the audience – you can be wrong, but never lie."

Bill Handel told the story of being on the air on 9/11. Asked how he'd like to be remembered, he said "not as a broadcaster. The most important thing that I've done is to help create 2,400 babies for people who wouldn't have them." Bill was referring to his work as founder of the Center for Surrogate Parenting. When asked who he listens to on radio, Bill said "Tim has the best hour on radio."



PPB's ART GILMORE CAREER ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

That lovely award, the Art Gilmore Career Achievement Award, we give to our honored guests each luncheon, is named after our founding president. For PPB members who did not have a chance to know this outstanding man, here are some facts



regarding him. Art was 98 when he passed away in September of 2010. He led a full life both professionally and as a family man. He was married to his wife, the lovely Grace, for 72 years and he was a grandfather and great grandfather.

Art was born and educated in Tacoma, WA. While studying speech at what is now Washington State University, he became an announcer on the campus radio station. He left school in 1935 and became staff announcer at KOL in Seattle.

Moving to Los Angeles in 1936, he became a staff announcer at KFWB and soon went to work at the CBS-owned KNX.

During World War II, he served as an officer in the Navy in the Pacific. He was a board member and reader for Recording for the Blind and Dyslexic, local and national president of AFTRA and a deacon at Bel Air Presbyterian Church. He loved to fly, boat, travel, and play golf.

On radio, he was the announcer on shows such as *Amos 'n' Andy, Dr. Christian, Red Ryder* and *The Sears Radio Theater*.

Moving to television in the 1950s, he was the announcer for *The George Gobel Show* and was the announcer on *The Red Skelton Show* for 16 years. He was narrator on the TV series *Mackenzie's Raiders, Men of Annapolis,* and *Highway Patrol* ... all 156 episodes. Moviegoers heard his voice on more than 2,700 movie trailers, including those for *It's a Wonderful Life, The Best Years of Our Lives, Rear Window, Shane, Creature From the Black Lagoon* and the original *Ocean's* 11.

Among the odds and ends of a career that included narrating children's records and serving as national spokesman for Chrysler, Gilmore was the voice of President Franklin D. Roosevelt in the 1942 movie *Yankee Doodle Dandy*.

You should also know Art was the driving force in our breaking away from a group of New York broadcasters that the West Coast radio broadcasters had joined. It turned out the New York group wanted most of the dues, so Art said "Let's have our own luncheon club." This took place in January of 1966 and 178 broadcasters signed up immediately and within several months the membership stood at 500, all of whom were declared Charter members.

If there ever was a "gentle man" it was Chairman of the Board Art Gilmore.
