



# MY MEMORIES OF HOW IT ALL BEGAN By PPB Charter Member Barbara Fuller

"Sometime in the early '60s, a group of actors in New York joined together to form Broadcast Pioneers. As I remember the story, Hollywood's honorary mayor, Johnny Grant, thought we should be part of it. He rounded up some potential recruits (of which I was one) for a meeting at the Brown Derby. The idea took off. PPB became a part of the NY group but various circumstances seemed to make it wise to separate, not the least of which was that we were sending half our dues back to them. We also realized that we were following different paths — our luncheons at the Sportsmen's Lodge for instance (thank you, Jeanne!).

One of the most important people at the beginning was Bob Ahmanson of Home Savings. Because of Bob's interest in broadcasting, we were able to have our Club Room in the basement of the bank at Sunset and Vine where we held Nostalgia Nights for so many happy years."

Barbara's career began on radio in 1932 playing Little Georgie Gobel's sister. She portrayed Clauda on "One Man's Family" for 14 years, appeared in motion pictures and on TV, once opposite Charles Boyer in the "Four Star Playhouse" episode titled "Alias Mr. Hepp."

At the time, Johnny Carson was host of the weekday afternoon quiz show "Who Do You Trust?" on ABC. Because he was under contract through September (and they

held him to his contract until the day it expired), he couldn't take over as host of "Tonight" until October 1, 1962.

The show originated from New York for the first 10 years before moving to "beautiful downtown Burbank."

Along with announcer and side-kick Ed McMahon and conductor Doc Severinsen, Johnny would host "Tonight" for the next 30 years.

# BROADCASTING MILESTONE: OCTOBER 1, 1962 JOHNNY CARSON SUCCEEDS JACK PAAR ON "THE TONIGHT SHOW"

Created by NBC President Sylvester "Pat" Weaver, "The Tonight Show Starring Steve Allen" debuted in 1954. As Allen began concentrating on his Sunday evening comedy variety show, he shared hosting duties with Ernie Kovacs. Jack Paar took over in 1957 and left five years later.

**JEANETTE BARNES** — Secretary on the Jack Benny and Amos 'n Andy radio shows. On TV, she worked on "Tony Orlando and Dawn," "Donnie and Marie" and specials.

**ERNEST BORGNINE** — Oscar winner for Best Actor in *Marty*. Ernie had a prolific seven-decade career in film and television, moving easily from scoundrels and serious portrayals to a comedic role on the 1960s TV sitcom "McHale's Navy."

**CHAD EVERET** — Although he appeared in over 40 film and TV series, Chad was best known for his role as Dr. Joe Gannon on "Medical Center" on CBS from 1969 to 1976.

**NORMAN FELTON** — Writer, producer and director. Cocreated "The Man from U.N.C.L.E." and exec produced TV series, including "Dr. Kildare."

He was head of the motion picture division of Rogers & Cowan for 18 years before starting his own firm. During his long career, Dale spearheaded the publicity campaigns for over 150 films and represented stars including Marilyn Monroe, Clint Eastwood, Steve McQueen, Gene Kelly, Tony Curtis, Shirley MacLaine and Rock Hudson during the actor's public battle with AIDS. Dale was a longtime trustee for the Actor's Fund.

GINNY TYLER — A voice actress, Ginny was a Disney Legend and member of Radio Enthusiasts of Puget Sound (REPS). She was the Head Mouseketeer when the original "Mickey Mouse Club" was re-edited for syndication in 1962. Ginny worked on dozens of cartoons and animated films and was the voice of Minnie Mouse, Pinocchio and Casper the Friendly Ghost.
