FRIDAY EVENING, OCTOBER 26, the Thousand Oaks Library Foundation, home of the American Radio Archives, will pay tribute to famed writer **NORMAN CORWIN** as he directs his own comedy, *A Strange Affliction.* Mr. **CORWIN** is often called the Poet Laureate of Radio for his contributions to radio drama from the late 1930s to the present. The evening will also be a fund raiser for the construction of a new wing which will house PPB's archives.

Carl Reiner and Samantha Eggar head up the cast. Also starring will be **NORMAN LLOYD**, **LINDA** **HENNING**, Marvin Kaplan, **JOHN HARLAN**, Peter Dennis, **LEONARD MALTIN**, **JANET WALDO**, Shay Duffin and others. The comedy was first written and directed by Mr. **CORWIN** for CBS' "Radio Theatre," and produced in the late 1970s by Elliott Lewis and Fletcher Markle.

Then in 1994, **NORMAN CORWIN** directed his comedy for the California Artists Radio Theatre at the Cinegrill of the historic Hollywood Roosevelt Hotel. That production was produced for "NPR Playhouse" by CART, and was presented on a double bill with **CORWIN**'s *My Client Curly*, which starred John Astin. Ms. Eggar and David Warner played the leads in the 1994 CART production. Many of the original performers will repeat their roles October 26.

Composer Kenneth Strange will play his original score and **MARTY HALPERIN** will engineer. Tony Palermo, associated with current CART and Thousand Oaks Library Foundation productions, will handle sound effects.

Attendance will be by invitation only, however, those interested in the event may phone the library at (805) 449-2660 for further information about the program and to request an invitation. A "gala" reception will follow the program, with Mr. **CORWIN** and other celebrities in attendance.
